Project Story

Having won eight 'Homes for Scotland' Awards in the last three years, Springfield are now well established as one of the major players in the house builder market in Scotland. The company has grown steadily over the past 25 years and bought over Redrow in Scotland in 2011. They currently build around 500 homes every year. As part of a planning condition for their site in Uddingston they were required by South Lanarkshire Council to provide a small play area for toddlers.

A relatively small area was identified as the location for the area, however the Proludic design team were able to fit in a large number of play items appropriate to the toddler age group with climbing, swinging, sliding, springy and rotating items.

The whole area is nicely finished off with patterned wet pour safety surfacing. This was located within an attractive black bow-top fence with a bright yellow outward opening gate at the entrance.


