Project Story

This project is part of a Town Park redevelopment program. Shirebrook Town Council wanted to deliver a large destination park as phase one of this on-going project to rejuvenate the park, encouraging families back to site. Future phases in the project will include a splash pad, fitness trail and an area for ball

games. Additionally formal and informal gardens and an orchard are also proposed!

The toddler play space was inspired by the local mining heritage of Shirebrook. Proludic utilised it's capability of creating bespoke play structures and unique play spaces to provide a fantastic destination play space.



Themed equipment meets children's need to invent stories by imitating their everyday experiences, and with the possibility of doing things differently.

As children grow older, their ability to imagine and engage in fantasy fuels their play experiences and improves interaction with others. They acquire greater ease of communication, making it easier to lean and develop self-confidence.











Inclusive Play

Children with disabilities are like any other children, in that to progress they need to develop their cognitive, psychomotor and social skills as well as their independence. They need to engage in the same activities as their friends, within their own capacities: climbing, jumping, running, touching, imagining ... for their own benefit and to be able to share and interact with others. They want to enjoy themselves like everyone else, with everyone else.
