## Community Group raise money to build a MUGA

## Project Story

The local community of Upperton worked hard to provide new play and recreational facilities for the residents. The locals set up a community group to apply for funding and managed to raise almost £60,000 from various bodies including the Wind Farm Trust. As a multi-use games area (MUGA)

was needed by the locals, three companies were invited to provide competitive designs for the project. Proludic won the tender, and the distinctive MUGA was built. It includes sound dampening buffering on the panels, and goals for football and basketball. The line markings for both sports are in yellow and contrasts well with the galvanised, powder coated paintwork of the posts and sports panels.





The project has been a massive success with adults as well as the children of all ages. We have had no maintenance to do other than a bit of litter picking. Proludic really helped us from start to finish and I am happy to recommend them.
