Project Story

South Ribble Borough Council wanted to provide an exciting play area that had the potential to become a key development project. The play area would represent the first stage of the council's renewals programme which aims to regenerate and improve the surrounding areas. They wanted the play area to be accessible to all ages and abilities and reflect their core values.

Proludic designed a play area with different zones that all compliment each other but aim to target different ages and abilities. The zones were desert island discovery for young children and toddlers, a nature area with sensory experiences, Volcano adventure, space exploration for older children and a dynamic challenge for teenagers. The volcano adventure provides a real focal point for the park at 7 metres high and has varying platforms and play experiences with a large tubular slide.

Withy Grove was opened to the public in 2007 and has become one of the country's top destination parks.
